



Maple Weekend *March*

Snirt Run

April

Defined as a combination of snow and dirt, the SNIRT RUN is an ATV/OHV Poker Run hosted by Barnes Corners Sno-Pals as an annual fundraiser. This event has grown annually to become the largest ATV/OHV event in New York State and attracts thousands of riders every year!

Adiron-Duck Race

April

Horseback Riding

The Otter Creek Horse Trails have about 65 miles of wonderful horse-riding trails. The Otter Creek Horse Trails are located on the Independence River Wild Forest Unit of the NYS Forest Preserve and on the Independence River and Otter Creek State Forests on the western border of the Adirondack Park.

These trails are made of old sandy roads and wooded trails. The trails all loop and are well-marked, so you won't get lost! The trails follow or cross the Independence River and other small waterways – creating a scenic and relaxed atmosphere that is beautiful in any season.

Don't forget to stop by the Assembly Area – a state managed, equine camping facility that is free for the riding public to use.



Beaver River

Up for an adventure? Paddle 14-miles on the Beaver River Canoe Route from Moshier Falls to High Falls!

Black River

Explore 125 miles of one of the main contributors to the economic growth of Lewis County.

Moose River

With a high gradient Moose River is considered a mountain waterway which is why it is a favorite for kayakers and whitewater rafters!

Oswegatchie River

With three branches and 137 miles, the West Branch of the Oswegatchie River is the only section in Lewis County. The West Branch is not canoe friendly due to its small and narrow feeder streams.

Brantingham Lake

Offering public boating and fishing, visitors and locals alike are welcome to bring their kayaks and canoes for a leisurely paddle through the lake.

Lake Bonaparte

A great location to spend the day! Lake Bonaparte has a public swimming area, and a state boat launch. The lake is stocked annually with brown trout and lake trout, and other fish species like bullheads, walleyes, great northern pike, perch, and rock and black bass are all found in the lake.

If you're visiting in the winter, the lake is also open to ice fishing!






Hunting







Lewis County Trivia

54.7% of the land in Lewis County is wild/forested.

Lewis County ranks 3rd in New York State for Maple Production and produces 7.7% of the state's total maple syrup.

Lewis County is ranked [#]6 in NYS milk production.

22,235 cows live in Lewis County, with a total of 55,500 in total including calves and bulls. That's two cows for every one person living in the county!

The Black River runs **42 miles** through Lewis County, and only drops 6 inches to 12ft in elevation over these 42 miles.
