Duke Energy Renewables Proposed North Country Solar Power Facility Project Description

Duke Energy Renewables (DER) proposes to construct a 20.7 MW_{DC} solar power generation array on 72 acres of the 173-acre site. The array will be made up of approximately 55,000 tier-1-supplier, multicrystalline Mono-PERC photovoltaic (PV) modules rated at 400+/- watts. The current design has the PV modules mounted on a fixed tilt racking system. The design utilizes six 4 MW_{AC-nominal} inverter skids that collect the direct current (DC) power generated by the PV modules and covert it to alternating current (AC) power consistent with the interconnecting utilities system. Included within the inverters skids are transformers that transform the voltage to the 46 kV (kilovolt) voltage used by the utility. The balance of the DC system will include string wiring, combiner boxes, and power cables from the combiner boxes to the inverters. The AC collection system will bring the power from the inverters to the collection switchgear for connection to the utility at the Point of Interconnect (POI). The POI is located immediately adjacent to the project facility. To the extent solar technology and availability changes over time, certain design components described herein may change in the final design.

A permanent access road for the site will be constructed from State Route 12D. Most of the onsite access road from the public road entrance, throughout the project site will be designed and constructed of stone in accordance with local standards and design documents, to allow for maintenance access for the life of the project. DER shall install drainage features in accordance with permit drawings and shall take appropriate measures to maintain the site in a dry and safe condition.

The land use within the proposed footprint of the North Country Solar Facility is mainly pasture land that is utilized for hay production, with areas used for row crops (*i.e.*, corn). There are some mixed pine/hardwood and scrub-shrub habitats that are associated with potential wetland habitat located in the eastern and western portions of the property but are avoided with the present facility layout of panels and associated structures. The property also contains three (3) electrical transmission rights-of-way. The stormwater pollution prevention plan (SWPPP) design for this project will be submitted for regulatory review separately, and with sufficient time for review prior to construction.

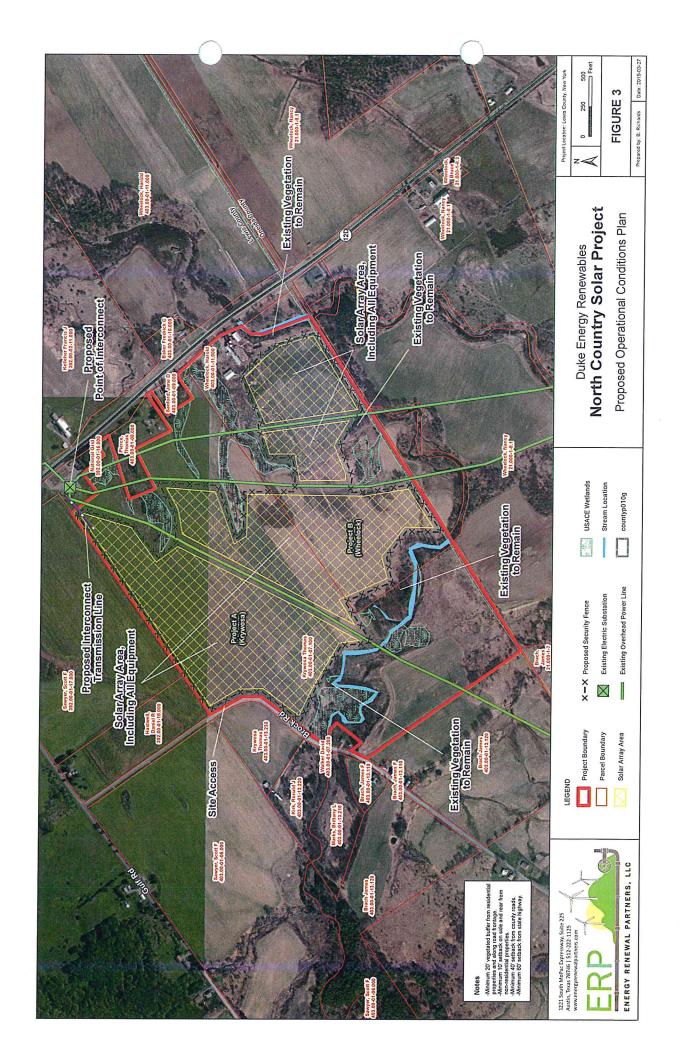

Agricultural Resources: The project requires the development of existing agricultural land, however, the decommissioning plan for the project will include removal of all structures that will allow the site to be used as agricultural land after the solar facility has completed its useful lifespan. No toxic materials will be stored or manufactured on the site, so soil will not be contaminated. Soil conservation best management practices are proposed (i.e., sedimentation and erosion control plans and post-construction plantings) to protect soil integrity Historic/Archaeological Resources: A Phase 1a Cultural Resources Survey will be conducted on the site to determine whether further investigation (Phase 1b Survey) needs to be performed. If any artifacts or sensitive areas are identified, the applicant will comply with direction of NYSOPRHP in avoiding, minimizing, or mitigating potential impacts to cultural resources.

Energy Impacts: The project will generate 20.7 MW (DC) of energy that will be contributed to the regional electric power grid. This is not anticipated to create any new local energy demands, and will provide clean energy for the power grid.

Consistency with Community Plans: This will be the first solar power project in the Town of Leyden, so is not consistent with past land uses. However, it will not induce population growth, change density of development, require any new public infrastructure, or induce secondary development pressure in the community, so is not likely to materially interfere with the local development patterns or character.

Labor Impact

The construction of the solar project is like most construction projects in that the demand for labor peaks somewhat in the middle of the project and the demands for different trades varies throughout the construction process. The active construction period for a project of this size is typically 6 months with some minor activity continuing another 3 months for fine tuning and performance check out of the project. At the peak the project could have as many as 50-75 individuals working on the project. Duke Energy Renewables Solar will advertise locally to fill its labor needs and make reasonable efforts to maximize use of local labor and suppliers as long as local laborers and suppliers are qualified and cost competitive.

The management of the construction project is typically staffed from full-time employees of a Contractor, with a high percentage of the remaining labor being comprised local hired labor (based on availability) and local subcontractors. An example of a local subcontractor we have seen on previous projects would be fencing installation.

The initial construction starts with civil work grading and clearing the site, quickly moving into post-installation used to support the racking system (supports for the modules). The peak labor need occurs when there is an overlap of activities on the site. There will be posts being driven, racking being installed, modules being placed, inverters being placed, wiring being installed, etc. The project will have a variety of labor needs, such as laborers, operators and electricians.

The construction activity typically provides additional economic stimulus by also supporting local businesses such as hotels, restaurants, gas stations, hardware stores and equipment rental companies.

Post construction, projects of this size are not typically manned by a full-time on-site presence. All of Duke's solar projects, at a minimum, are monitored remotely 24/7/365. Members of our O&M team will make regular on-site visits to check on the site and perform maintenance and operational testing. Ongoing local services are typically required to meet the long-term operational and maintenance (O&M) needs of the solar facilities. Typical we utilize local workforce for things such as vegetation management and other O&M services.
